## WHAT'S THE PURPOSE?

*Students want to know!*



### RESPONSIBLE FREEDOM

College is just a glimpse of the autonomy that comes with "adulting."

Expressing that freedom doesn't occur in a vacuum; our choices should be guided by **ethical standards** that respect the dignity of others.

Part of responsible freedom is fulfilling educational goals with **integrity**.



### ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

When students complete their work dishonestly, that insinuates that the standards they hold others to don't apply them (would they want a doctor who cheated in Anatomy & Physiology class?)

As you know, society requires **knowledgeable** and **skilled** people to sustain itself and to creatively problem solve.



### PUBLIC GOOD

When students circumvent merit-based success, issues like false credentialing, incompetent labor, and harmful shortcuts arise that erode the institutions everyone relies on.

# ACADEMIC HONOR POLICY 101

## WHAT ARE THE RULES?

*Help your students avoid these violations:*



### PLAGIARISM

Presenting the work of another as one's own (i.e., without proper acknowledgement of the source).

### CHEATING

Improper access to or use of any information or material that is not specifically condoned by the instructor for use in the academic exercise.

### UNAUTHORIZED GROUPWORK

Unauthorized collaborating with others; this includes unauthorized actions taken on any social media platform.

### FABRICATION, FALSIFICATION, & MISREPRESENTATION

Unauthorized altering or inventing of any information or citation that is used in assessing academic work.

### MULTIPLE SUBMISSION

Submitting the same academic work (including oral presentations) for credit more than once without instructor permission.

### ABUSE OF ACADEMIC MATERIALS

Intentionally damaging, destroying, stealing, or making inaccessible library or other academic resource material.

### COMPLICITY

Intentionally helping another to commit an act of academic dishonesty.

### ATTEMPTING

Making an effort to commit any offense outlined above.
