






Best 6-Year Graduation Rate in University History

- 74% four-year rate, ties with our record
- Among the highest rates in the nation






REPRESENTATIVE GRANTS


- \$14.7M National Institute on Aging consortium grant to work with technologies to promote well-being, quality of life, and independence of older adults, including those with cognitive impairments
- \$4.9M National Institute of Mental Health grant to reduce HIV infections among young adults
- \$9M to expand 'gamified' treatments for pediatric ADHD

NEW FACULTY

- Kate Muessig, PhD
- Recruited from UNC-Chapel Hill to join the FSU College of Nursing
- Garnered \$100M in NIH grants
- Launching the Institute on Digital Health and Innovation
 - Advance digital health science, technologies, and tools to solve real-world needs

UNIVERSITY ACCREDITATION

- Workgroup members from across FSU are drafting 124
 narratives and providing supporting evidence
- Committee appointed to develop a Quality Enhancement Plan focused on a topic from the Strategic Plan regarding doctoral education
- Accreditation provides an opportunity to improve quality of processes and programs
- Onsite Reaffirmation Committee in March 2024 will meet with select members of the FSU BOT following visits to Republic of Panama, Panama City (Florida), and the FSU Ringling Center for Cultural Arts

STRATEGIC PLAN

- BOT asked to extend the current plan, which is scheduled to expire 12/22
- The BOT directed that the extended plan be aligned with the President's Top 10 Goals, AAU Readiness & FSU Health
- A committee is working on extending the goals and refining the potential tactics and outcomes
- Will be vetted by internal and external stakeholders, then by the Cabinet, the BOT, and the BOG
