

FACULTY AWARDS AND THE UNIVERSITY

Experiences of FSU faculty who applied for national fellowships and awards confirm that both the process of application and the eventual experience of the fellowship or award did the following for individual faculty careers:

- publicized faculty work;
- built networks for collaboration;
- increased ability to recruit quality graduate students;
- deepened critical thinking within a particular research project;
- enhanced teaching.

At FSU, national and international fellowship and awards recognized by TARU benefit the institution broadly by:

- providing a key metric for Preeminent status and funding;
- influencing national rankings;
- securing a national platform for research comparable other R1 institutions.

A **KEY** factor in facilitating successful faculty fellowship and award application is department chair mentorship. Department chairs are uniquely situated to be aware of cutting edge research, to have knowledge of faculty's ability to risk, and to fairly manage university leave policies. To reap the most benefit from faculty awards, mentorship is required to make faculty award ready, to complete the application process, and to make public the value of the award after its obligations have been met.
